Furthermore, we appreciate the opportunities provided to Sri Lanka to join a number of Copyright and creative industry programs by the copyright division via online during the Covid 19 pandemic period.

Government of Sri Lanka intends to access WIPO Internet treaties in the next biennium.

Today, Sri Lanka strives to remain resilient in the face of a grave economic crisis that has impacted the day to day life of its people.
